






A further 8 persons have recovered from Covid-19, after having tested negative for the virus. Their ages vary between 20 years and 70 years. Up till now, 126 persons have recovered from the virus. At the same time, there were 4 cases of persons who tested positive during the 574 tests that have been carried out. 3 of these live in the Hal Far open centre, where 38 persons have tested positive for Covid-19 so far. They are being held in a building that is separate from the main building, so that they may be given the necessary treatment. At the moment, there are 302 active Covid-19 cases in Malta. The number of persons who are recovering from the virus in hospitals has decreased. There are 2 patients in ITU, 16 patients in Boffa, 8 at a private hospital, and the rest are at home under medical observation. The appeal remains for any one who has symptoms to phone 111, and for anyone who has been given an appointment, to honour such appointment, irrespective of the day when this is slated for.




CLEANSING IN HOUSING ESTATES

A cleansing programme in the various housing estates around Malta has been widened, especially with regards to sterilization of the communal areas, with the aim of safeguarding the residents' health. This is an essential project, at a time when thousands of families are spending long hours in their homes. During the first month alone, cleansing works were carried out on 400 blocks, and thus will benefit some 2,800 families. In various housing estates we find various elderly residents, who are not in a position to carry out the necessary cleaning themselves. Thus, Government will intervene by means of 100 employees from a private company, who are benefiting from the fiscal measures enacted by Government and, instead of cashing the benefit and staying home, are giving back to their community.









43 persons were each fined €100 during the continuous rounds Police are conducting to ensure that no gatherings involving more than 3 persons take place in public places, as per the legal notice issued by Government. In the meantime, no one was found breaching quarantine during any of the 818 inspections carried out in the last 24 hours. The appeal remains for one and all to be responsible and co-operate with the directives issued by the authorities.



A message of courage to all Maltese and Gozitans is being virtually put up daily from 8pm onwards on the Cittadella bastions. This projection will continue being screened for another 15 days, and is dedicated to a courageous people who never backed down when faced with diseases or wars. It is also a message o prevention, so that we may all be more careful, and protect ourselves, against Covid-19.









The voluntary repatriation assistance scheme for all foreign citizens has been extended till 10th May. This government scheme is intended for European Union citizens, as well as others who are not, and who are in Malta for reasons of work, education, familial, or other reasons, so that they may return to their countries against nominal payment.

The groupage complex at the Malta Customs in Hal Far has been disinfected and fumigated as part of the unceasing efforts by the authorities to limit the spread of Covid-19. This disinfectation and fumigation exercise has been carried out by employees of for Civil Protection Department, who donned protective gear specifically-intended for such occasions, and specialized equipment. Afterwards, Public Cleansing employees made sure to clean the warehouses – 26 bonds in all. Similar cleaning has been carried out at the Newport Bonded Stores, and Mifsud Verandahs in Marsa, where 52 Customs warehouses are situated.
